Professor MacMahon is co-founder and Principal Director of The George Institute for Global Health, a global medical research organisation dedicated to improving the health of disadvantaged populations worldwide. The George Institute has offices in Australia, China, India and the UK, a global staff of around 500, and operations in more than 50 countries. Prof. MacMahon also holds appointments as Professor of Medicine & James Martin Fellow at the University of Oxford, Professor of Cardiovascular Medicine & Epidemiology at the University of Sydney and Professor of Public Health at Peking University. He is an international authority on the causes, prevention and treatment of heart and vascular diseases. His special interest is the management of chronic and complex medical conditions in resource-poor settings, particularly in the Asia-Pacific region. Prof. MacMahon has published several hundred scientific papers and has received numerous awards, fellowships and honours from a wide range of learned societies. In 2012, was appointed to the Fellowship of the Australian Academy of Science (FAA) and the Fellowship of the British Academy of Medical Sciences (FMedSci). In 2013 he was named EY Social Entrepreneur of the Year.
